## Lock Down

At Bourne we take safeguarding very seriously and it is important that we continue to monitor our procedures, taking into account even those events that are extremely unlikely to occur. As part of this process we are going to be introducing something called 'lock down'.

A lock down procedure is a standard health and safety procedure, similar to a fire drill. Our lock down procedure would be used if there was a threat to pupils, staff or others in the school, and when it is safer for everyone to remain in the school rather than evacuate. The aim is to keep people safe by confining them to a secure place of safety.
