## P.E. GRANT EXPENDITURE 2018/2019 REPORT TO PARENTS

### OBJECTIVES

1. Reduce levels of childhood obesity across the school
2. Increase participation in local sports partnership – competitions, events for year groups, training and support for teachers. Additional after school club.
3. Continue training for teaching staff, lunchtime staff and pupil games leaders.
4. Enhanced PE provision across the school.
5. Improved use of professional coaches for after school clubs.
6. Additional hours for support and teaching staff to run lunchtime and after-school clubs.
7. Outdoor and adventurous activity sessions.
8. Access to opportunities for talented pupils.

### IMPACT OF P.E. GRANT 2017-2018

Staff have become more confident in the planning and use of orienteering across the curriculum

Intra-house competition is happening 3 times a year

There has been an increased attendance at Level 2 inter competitions from previous years

Bourne achieved the School Games Mark and were awarded SILVER!

The number of less active children participating in clubs has increased

There are a greater number of sports clubs offered at Bourne

Sports leaders have become confident in leading PE, working as a team to support all year groups across the school

Children have gained more skills using age appropriate equipment
