## P.E. GRANT EXPENDITURE 2014/15 REPORT TO PARENTS

### OBJECTIVES

1. Increased participation in local sports partnership – competitions, events for year groups, training and support for teachers. Additional after school club.
2. Training for teaching staff, lunchtime staff and pupil games leaders.
3. To organise inter house competitions and enhance PE provision across the school.
4. Improved use of professional coaches for after school clubs.
5. Additional hours for support and teaching staff to run lunchtime and after-school clubs.
6. Outdoor and adventurous activity sessions.
7. Access to opportunities for talented pupils.

### IMPACT OF P.E. GRANT 2013-2014

All P.E. lessons observed showed elements of good learning with some outstanding

Increased provision of sports clubs on offer:

-7 sports clubs in 2012-2013

-11 sports clubs in 2013-2014

Increased number of children taking up sports clubs:

-136 children attended sports clubs in 2012-2013

-186 children attended sports clubs in 2013-2014

Gifted and talented gym club, dance club and football club provided throughout the year

-The gifted and talented gym club came first in the County Championship

-The gifted and talented girls football club came second in the local league

Attendance of local competitive sports sessions

Inter house competitions introduced in the school
