P.E. GRANT EXPENDITURE 2015/16 REPORT TO PARENTS

OBJECTIVES

1. Maintain and widen participation in local sports partnership – competitions, events for year groups, training and support for teachers. Additional after school club.
2. Training for teaching and lunchtime staff (response to audited needs)
3. Organise inter house competitions and enhance PE provision across the school.
4. Additional hours for support and teaching staff to run lunchtime and after-school clubs.
5. Access to opportunities for talented pupils.
6. Increased opportunities for pupil-led exercise at playtimes and lunchtimes

IMPACT OF P.E. GRANT 2014-2015

1. Increased participation in local sports partnership – competitions, events for year groups, training and support for teachers. Additional after school club.
 - The school participated in local and county events, and provided supervision and transport to these events
2. Training for teaching staff, lunchtime staff and pupil games leaders.
 - All teaching staff received training in Outdoor and Adventurous Activities
3. To organise inter house competitions and enhance PE provision across the school.
 - Summer Sports days for year 1 to 6 included inter-house competition. Games activities within P.E. lessons regularly feature competitive opportunities
4. Improved use of professional coaches for after school clubs.
 - 118 children attended sports clubs in 2014-2015
5. Additional hours for support and teaching staff to run lunchtime and after-school clubs.
 - 7 sports-based clubs were offered after school by school staff, and additional coaching and club opportunities were provided by private providers in partnership with the school
6. Outdoor and adventurous activity sessions.
 - All teaching staff received training in Outdoor and Adventurous Activities, and an orienteering course was established within the school grounds
7. Access to opportunities for talented pupils:
 - Gifted and talented gym club, dance club and football club provided throughout the year
 - The gifted and talented gym club achieved several medal places in the County Championship including first place in our age group
 - The gifted and talented girls football club won the local league and the Cup
